The Nasukogen Visitor Center is located near Nasuyumoto Hot Spring in Nasu-town, Tochigi Prefecture.

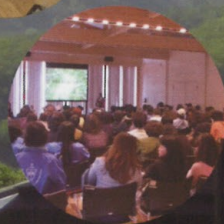
The center provides information on the Nasu-Kashi area, which is a part of the Nikko National Park.

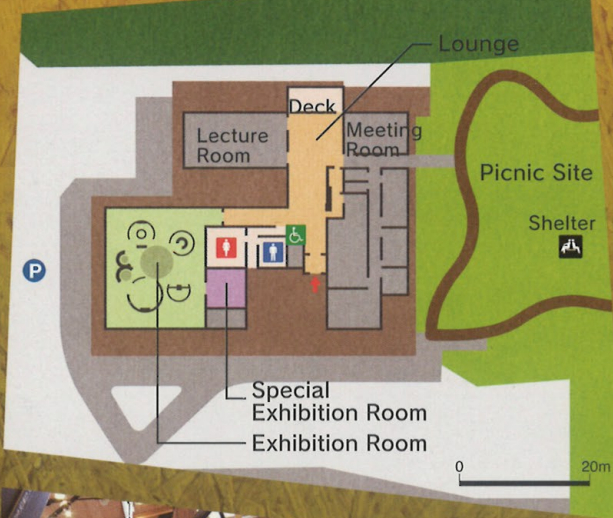

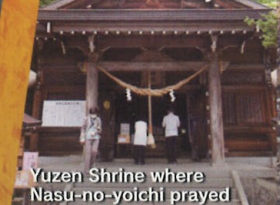

Various panels, videos and samples will introduce you to the development of the Nasu Kashi area in terms of both nature and history.

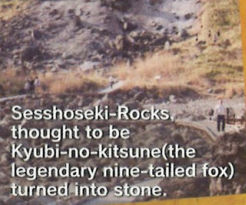
Let's explore the Nasu Kashi area!

If you walk slowly, you may discover something new. If you visit the central part of the Nasuyumoto Hot Spring area, you'll be able to learn about the history of Nasuyumoto and communicate with local people. You can also enjoy hiking through the nature, and study trails nearby for a couple of hours. If you extend your journey, there are many destinations to explore such as Nasu Heisei-no-mori, the Nasu Mountain Range, Numappara Marsh, and the Yukiwari Bridge.

Yuzen Shrine where Nasu-no-yoichi prayed

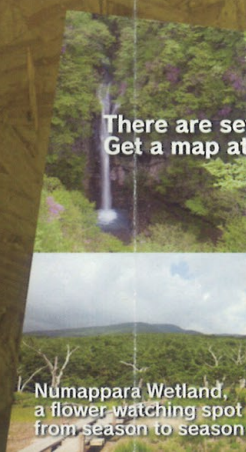


Sesshoseki-Rocks, thought to be Kyubi-no-kitsune (the legendary nine-tailed fox) turned into stone.

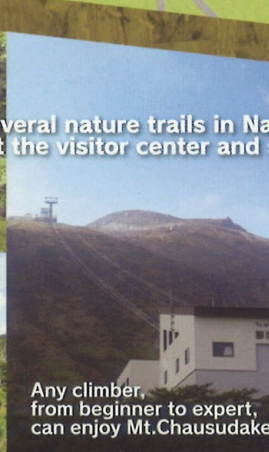


There are always fun events being held, such as indoor stamp rallies or hands-on craft workshops. Photo exhibitions, etc., can also be held. (Advance consultation required)

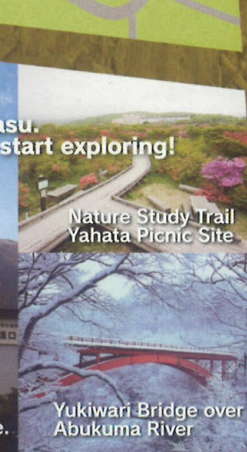
There are several nature trails in Nasu. Get a map at the visitor center and start exploring!
